

Impact Report 2016 – 2017

The specialist sports package provided us with coaches from DeLacy Academy and they have worked alongside our staff in PE lessons to develop our staff's confidence in teaching specific areas of the curriculum through the use of observation and team teaching. The sports package also provided links with other schools to compete in sporting events. Our pupils have also benefited from expert coaching in a wide range of sporting and physical exercise areas and this is shown within teacher assessments.

Long term planning has been implemented and is now being followed by all staff throughout the academy. As such the children are receiving broad and balance P.E lessons covering a range of areas. This also clearly shows progress throughout the year and between year groups.

Participation in physical activity on an extra-curricular level has increased due to lunch time and after school clubs being provided throughout the week. There is a good level of participation in inter-school events and the children have enjoyed competing against other schools in sporting events.

Pupil-voice was carried out during the year to find out children's responses to physical activity. It showed that children wanted more sporting equipment available at playtimes and lunch time. This has been provided and it is evident that more children are now actively involved in games.

The funding was largely used on replenishing old equipment and ensuring new equipment was relevant and could aid in delivering the curriculum to a high standard. This has had great impact on lessons as teachers can now plan and deliver more interesting and varied activities.

This year with a raise in the sports funding we have the opportunity to use funds in a variety of ways to further improve and develop the teaching and learning across the academy. We will be spending a lot of time working with professionals in a range of targeted areas so that teachers can continue to further their practice.

We will encourage pupils to continue to lead healthy lifestyles through targeted teaching and will also provide a range of learning opportunities for children to enjoy PE and sport and experience high quality teaching. Children will have even more opportunities to take part in competition and aim for sporting excellence through close links with other schools both within the Delta Academies Trust and the local community.

Over the past 4 years we have used sports funding to purchase a sports partnership package with De Lacy Academy who have provided Willow Green with PE specialists to work alongside our teachers to develop their skills and knowledge and to enhance the quality of the teaching of physical education. This will continue within the coming year with additional professionals leading classes and offering development to teachers across the academy.

The academy recognises the positive impact on the quality of the teaching of PE and the need to use our funding in 2017/2018 to promote a range of sporting activity and healthy lifestyles.

Having already seen impact of the funding from the previous 4 years we hope for this additional funding to have continued and sustained impact on provision of PE and sport within our academy. The following areas have been identified to be addressed in PE this year:

- Developing teaching in gymnastics and dance to deliver consistently good or better lessons which ensure progression
- Increased awareness of healthy lifestyles
- The need to provide a wider range of sporting activity through lunch time and after school clubs.
