## Willow Green Academy Sport Premium Plan Review: 2022 – 2023

## Sports Premium 2022 - 2023

£17760

Our PE curriculum aims to increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all pupils learning and staff teaching PE whilst providing a broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils. It also aims to increase participation in competitive sport both in trust-wide and authority-wide competitions.

In addition, our PE curriculum sets out to develop pupils' physical literacy. This includes: physical competence, confidence and motivation. While it is important for children to develop their physical literacy, it is not something that can fully be achieved or acquired. In other words one cannot be "physically literate". Instead our curriculum sets out to support pupils on their own physical literacy journey and each child will be evaluated on their level of physical literacy at 3 points within the academic year.

In our continued work with Elite Kids Coaching, we have the opportunity to use funds in a variety of ways to further improve and develop the teaching and learning across the academy. A key area of focus this year is for our school teachers to build their expertise and confidence in teaching PE, by working with professionals in a range of targeted areas. We are also pleased to be able to continue our offer of Forest Schools to pupils, starting with our Year 5 pupils, initially, which will take place weekly in our landscaped nature area.

We will encourage pupils to continue to lead healthy lifestyles through targeted teaching and will also provide a range of learning opportunities for children to enjoy PE and sport. We will begin to target specific children to engage in school sport, be it after-school clubs or school competitions. One way we hope to achieve this is in the use of PE Pro, an app that will help to baseline and assess pupils in 5 key areas. This information will help us pinpoint exact areas to focus on in our after-school clubs and provide specific pupils with the opportunity to take part in a wide-range of clubs with professional coaches, with the desired outcome to accelerate their progress in that area.

From the beginning of the Autumn term, Willow Green pupils will have even more opportunities to take part in competitions, building on a very successful programme with Leeds United Foundation and Wildcat Girls' Football, which saw our girl's football team win our regional competition and make it to the Primary School Games finals, as well as many other year groups enjoying success in the Elite competitions. As a school, we will continue to maintain close PE links with other schools both within the local Delta Academies Trust and West Yorkshire Games.

We have previously used sports funding to purchase a sports partnership package with Elite Kids Coaching who have provided Willow Green Academy with PE specialists to work alongside our teachers to develop their skills and knowledge and to enhance the quality of the teaching of physical education. This year we will continue to work with Elite Kids Coaching who will lead sessions whilst offering development to teachers across the academy, through co-taught lessons, twilight training and competitions.

The academy recognises the positive impact on the quality of the teaching of PE and the need to use our funding in 2022/2023 to promote a range of sporting activity and healthy lifestyles.

## Objectives of spending:


- To continue to improve the provision of PE and sport at Willow Green Academy through staff development.
