

In Geography, we got our first glimpse of our REC driving text, The Big Picture Book of London.

We've had an exciting week in Year 3! Our young writers have been hard at work using their skills with short burst writing exercises, focusing on our verbs, adverbs and adjectives. In our art lessons, our budding cave artists have been experimenting with crosshatching techniques and practicing with graded pencils to change tone, producing some fantastic artwork along the way. Additionally, we had a special visit from dental hygiene experts who engaged our children in an informative and fun discussion about the importance of caring for their teeth. Another busy week this week in Year 3 and great effort from all the class!

Year 5 Weekly Attendance: 95%

What an amazing week we have had in Year 5! We have started to write our own innovated suspense stories, using personification, characters reactions and drip feeding a threat to help us build suspense. Within maths, we have finished our Place Value unit and have started to look at addition and subtraction. We have mastered mental strategies and have started to look at adding and subtracting numbers with more than 4 digits. During our reading lessons, we have focused on prediction this week. We have used clues from the text as well as the information we have gained from the blurb to help us to make accurate and detailed predictions. As well as this, we have continued our history unit on the Romans learning about Boudicca and why she played an important role in our history. We have completed another computing lesson, progressed with out swimming and forest school sessions as well as so much more. Well done on another outstanding week Year 5!



Year 4 Weekly Attendance: 93%

Year 4 have been working incredibly hard this week. In maths we have been busy focussing on rounding numbers to the nearest 10 and 100 and started to look at rounding numbers to 1000. This week in writing we completed our shared write of a portal story, ready to plan and write our hot write next week. We have continued to read 'The Iron Man' paying particular attention to inference questions, to really understand why our characters could be feeling a certain way and why the author might have done this. In science, we learnt about the importance of looking after our teeth and how brushing twice a day for 2 minutes support our teeth to stay healthy and even conducted an experiment to see what is the most effective at protecting our teeth. D.T this week as seen us explore, analyse and evaluate different nets and their purpose. It was Year 4's turn for Classroom kitchen which was a cause of great excitement, everyone enjoyed the making process of our summer-slaw, although not everyone was happy with the final product it is safe to say we all had fun making it. Year 6 Weekly Attendance: 90%

This week, the Year 6 class completed their bikeability sessions. They looked at maintaining their cycle with a smooth, calm and collected glide. They looked at controlling their bike: including setting off, cruising, slowing down, braking and stopping. Out on the roads, they looked at going round stationary vehicles parked on a road and how to negotiate the road using signals and road signs. In RE, they looked at Muslim monuments and justified their opinion on why/which monument they found the most special. In science, the class completed a research task on how water and nutrients are transported around the body. They had to find out the organs involved and the function they provided in this process.
