


## Head of Academy's Message Whole School Attendance: 94%

# Year 6 Weekly Attendance: 90%

Over the past week in mathematics, the focus has been on the concept of time, particularly the conversion between the 12-hour and 24-hour clock formats. Students have engaged in exercises and discussions aimed at enhancing their proficiency in reading and expressing time in both formats, developing a practical skill applicable in various real-life scenarios.

In art class, the emphasis has been on conveying emotion through landscapes. Students explored techniques and artistic elements that can evoke specific feelings within a landscape composition. The week involved hands-on projects where students experimented with colors, brushstrokes, and composition to effectively communicate emotions through their artwork, adding a subjective and personal dimension to their creative expressions.

In reading and writing sessions, students have delved into the power of vocabulary in shaping impressions of characters and settings. Analysing literature excerpts, students examined how carefully chosen words can create vivid mental images and convey subtle nuances of emotions. Through writing exercises, they practiced incorporating descriptive and evocative language to enhance the richness of their own narratives, gaining a deeper understanding of the role of vocabulary in storytelling and communication.
