


Head of Academy's Message Whole School Attendance: 93%

EY MAKATON SIGNERS OF THE WEEK: FSI - Tommy FS2 - Ren In EY this week, we have been busy practising for our Christmas performance on the 12th December. It was incredibly festive on Christmas jumper day, we enjoyed listening to Christmas music, Christmas colouring and games! In FS2 Maths, we have been exploring rectangles and squares, understanding that they both have 4 corners, but acknowledging why they are different (rectangle has 2 short sides and 2 long sides). In Jigsaw, we have been learning all about homes around the world and how they might look different or similar to our homes and being able to orally explain what they like about these using full sentences. In FS1, we have been thinking about our favourite part of the Brown Bear story. The children used their words to build a sentence to explain which part they enjoyed the most, they then drew a picture of this. In Pre Phonics our focus this week is 'minimal pairs'. We looked at a set of pictures and practised saying them, then played a game where Miss Frost said a particular picture and the children had to select the correct one. This can be very tricky and involve careful listening as the name of each picture sounds very similar. I.e. bee/beak, car/calf and bow/boat. The children tried really hard and showed excellent listening skills!

Our writing sessions have been dedicated to refining our portal stories, emphasizing better editing skills. While exploring 'Kensuke's Kingdom' together, we've focused on understanding the characters more deeply. Additionally, we concluded our Geography unit and began our Art lessons. Year 4

Weekly Attendance: 90%

Year 4 have continued to work extremely hard this week. In writing we have analysed a newspaper article, written headlines, bylines and leads and spent time practising how to write complex sentences with relative clauses. In maths, we have continued to work on our skills of multiplication and division with great success in our 7- and 11- times tables. Reading has seen us delve deeper into the new character of the space bat angle dragon! Time has been spent reading around unfamiliar words to work out their meaning. This week in Art, we have experimented with different materials to work out which would be best create an armature, newspaper pipe cleaners or wire. We also spent time learning how to make our own armatures, with great success! In science we have spent time discussing what food chains are, how they are created and who eats who. We even wrote down some of our own food chains to represent this. Well done on a great week year 4!



Year 6 Weekly Attendance: 91%

Our students have delved into the intricate art of suspenseful storytelling. From mysterious plot twists to intriguing characters, they are learning to weave narratives that keep readers on the edge of their seats. Central to our fiction unit is the utilisation of a 'Characterisation Toolkit." This toolkit serves as a guide for students to develop well-rounded characters, complete with unique traits, motivations, and flaws. By using this toolkit, our young authors are infusing life into their protagonists and antagonists, adding depth and complexity to their narratives. In art, we continued experimenting with texture to add a whole new dimension to artwork, turning a flat surface into a tactile and visually engaging masterpiece. Our students have been learning how to use everyday items to create unique textures that elevate their artistic expressions. Salt, known for its absorptive properties, has become a tool in our texture toolkit. Students have been experimenting with sprinkling salt onto wet watercolor paintings. As the paint dries, the salt absorbs moisture, creating fascinating patterns and textures that resemble crystallized formations. Also, Straws, typically used for sipping, have taken on a new role as texture creators. By blowing or dropping paint with straws, students have discovered how to manipulate the movement of colour
